#### Patrons Report

I have been concerned with heritage of w.A. matters outside the City of Stirling recently.

You may have read that the City of Perth voted recently to reject the placement of three quarters of the proposed entries for its Municipal Heritage Inventory. This raised considerable concern in the press and even provoked an editorial in the west Australian, which wondered if the City had any real commitment to the preservation of our built and natural heritage.

Another development is that the Town of Vincent has decided to put its heritage Advisory Committee on ice for a year. This committee did a great deal of work and helped to identify heritage places and suggested policies to manage them. Concern about these matters and the wholesale destruction of most of the remnant heritage by he East Pert Redevelopment Authority and the tunnel project have prompted the genesis of a Perth Inner City Society to try to emulate the achievements of this Society within the City of Stirling. It will be a focus for action for those closer to the City who seek to preserve more than a few fragments of the past in our inner metropolitan area.

We hope that the Perth Inner City
Society will be up and running in the
near future.

I am sure the Mount Lawley Society will afford it every assistance.

The Camellia is a familiar to most of us and there are some quite old specimens to be found in Mount Lawley Gardens. Originating from China, the Camellia has a long history and was brought to Australia in the early days of the colony. There are two main species of camellia growing, camellia japonica and camellia sasanqua. The sasanqua camellia is coming into bloom now and the japonica will bloom in late winter. The sasanqua camellia will take more sun and is now available in sizes from ground covers to large hedging plants. Therefore there is no excuse not include this lovely plant in your garden. Not only will you enjoy beautiful blooms, dark green glossy foliage but also add a little of the past to your garden.

### Information provided by Lawley Ward Councillor and candidate Rod Willox.

"The following significant outcomes have been achieved largely by my efforts in Council on behalf of Mt Lawley, Menora and Coolbinia residents:

- Creation of heritage precincts
- Establishment of the Heritage Advisory Committee
- Implementation of the "downzoning" in Mt Lawley and Menora to R12.5.
- Acceptance of the society's revised Design and Development Guidelines
- Extension of the Special Design Area from 5th Avenue to central Avenue
- Implementation of improved Municipal Inventory management policies
- Gained financial and corporate support from the City of Stirling against legal challenges to restrictive covenants
- Selection of Mt lawley for inclusion in the second round of underground power, due to commence shortly
- Negotiating for modified street light pole design to reflect local character
- Introduction of a policy banning mobile phone towers and aerials within 200 metres of residences or schools
- Supported Mt Lawley primary School P&C to have improved safety measures carried out on the Clifton Cr/Second and Third Avenue intersections
- Been involved in resolving a number of individual planning/building applications, which required intervention to conform to guidelines to protect streetscapes
- Re-development of the Mt Lawley Bowling Club building

I have been actively involved in graffiti control measures and supported introduction of security patrols (although I believe law and order is fundamentally a State Government function). These have both been highly successful.

I am making another attempt for an increase to \$20,000 of the maximum fine for illegal demolition in a heritage area, \$2,000 elsewhere. The fine is currently \$200.

Because of a perceived increase in commuter traffic "rat running" through our local streets, I am seeking funding for a traffic study in the area bounded by Longroyd / North / traffic management plan developed and implemented.

I am seeking funding for a "pelican" crossing, a pedestrian operated safety crossing to be signed,


